

Title: Mending broken hearts



Outline: Diseases of the heart and circulatory system (or CVD) were the second most common cause of death in the United Kingdom in 2014, with a total of around 155,000 deaths. The death rate from heart attacks has progressively reduced, due to major advances in treatment over the last 10 years. Leeds is the largest heart attack centre in the UK.

The speaker will describe the current treatment options and give insight into on-going clinical trials in Leeds/UK, which may further improve the potential for survival after a heart attack.

Whilst this talk will include pictures of a medical nature, it should be nothing worse that you see on TV!

Biog: John P. Greenwood MB CHB, PHD, FRCP is Professor of Cardiology and Consultant Cardiologist. He works within the Leeds Institute of Cardiovascular and Metabolic Medicine at the University of Leeds. He is interested in Clinical applications of Cardiovascular Magnetic Resonance and Percutaneous Coronary Intervention. He was Chief Investigator on the 'Cardiovascular magnetic resonance and single-photon emission computed tomography for diagnosis of coronary heart disease' (CE-MARC) prospective clinical trial.
