

Outline: Paul will outline his latest book which draws on the latest discoveries as well as his own firsthand experiences conducting field expeditions to remote corners of the world. In it he reveals what scientists are only now beginning to understand about the most prolonged and calamitous period of environmental crisis in Earth's history. He will also say something about how he went about turning his academic work into a book that could be enjoyed by the general public.
